NEIL NEZ KENDALL

Neil Kendall is a British born Burlesque personality and photographer and has been established on the worldwide Burlesque scene since 1990. He is known internationally as an award-winning photographer, shooting campaigns for iconic Burlesque celebrities such as Dita Von Teese who called him 'a genuine talent'.

His work has appeared in a diverse range of publications including Vogue Italia, The Guardian, GQ and New York Times and recently at the Victoria and Albert in London in the 'Undressed' exhibit. His 4th solo exhibition, entitled 'Saints and Sinners', was funded by the British Arts Council and drew national acclaim.

He is also known for his knowledge as a Burlesque Historian and his relationship with the last of the World's Burlesque Legends, he has contributed to many books on the subject.



His portable travelling Burlesque Museum based in England is the first of its kind in the world and his highly personal lecture to accompany the museum, '100 years of undressing to music', has been hosted all over Europe and the USA, most recently as guest speaker in Las Vegas Burlesque Hall of Fame.

In 2015 he was voted onto the board of Directors at the Burlesque Hall of Fame in Las Vegas making history as the first non-American to be unanimously elected to join the organisation. Since then he has travelled the world as an ambassador for the organisation.

Neil Kendall has been ranked as the Number 1 in the International Burlesque Top 50 non-performer listings – a global online poll within the Burlesque community.

He currently lives in England where he shoots most of his work from his studio in Chester.

AN INTERVIEW WITH NEIL NEZ KENDALL

How did you start in burlesque?

„I went to 'Exotic World', now known as 'The Burlesque Hall of Fame' in June 1988. No internet back then, just a hand written letter, that was all it took at that time to ask to see the Museum and that led me to Dixie Evans who ran it, back then she was a retired stripper known as 'The Marilyn Monroe of Burlesque' back in the 1950s, I worked on a book called Va Va Voom and I went there to meet legendary strippers Jennie Lee 'The Bazoom Girl' and Tempest Storm – it changed my life, Stormy. I was suddenly in this world of incredible women who lived in a community out in the desert in California, it was like Mad Max with strippers. I knew it was my destiny to be a part of that world, that world of burlesque. I knew I wanted to keep this decaying world alive and record the stories of these women. This was way before the internet and the rebirth of burlesque so I was there to see it all unfold. There was no one to document that world, so I did and I am so glad I kept the recordings.“

Who was the first burlesque performer you took pictures of?

„Really it was Jennie and Dixie. They both wore a lot of leopard skin, had huge breasts and had wild blonde hair; in fact they were like female impersonators, so they were larger than life in every sense to me this geeky little English guy with a camera.

I took pictures of Dixie on Jayne Mansfield's sofa which she owned – it was pink and heart shaped. It was black and white film as there were no digital cameras and she was 67 then and was just amazing to shoot. I loved Dixie, in fact we became friends for years till she passed away in her late 80s. It was the perfect starting point of my career really because she was the modern godmother of burlesque. She really brought burlesque out of the past and into the present by presenting a competition then called 'Miss Exotic World'. I went to the first one in 1990 as I was living in America at the time. It was an experience as it was in the Mohave Desert round an old swimming pool on a goat Ranch. What she started was to become 'Burlesque Hall of Fame Weekender'. So I want to recognise all she did.“



Whether it's Halloween, Winter Wonderland or vintage circus/side show – you create the most incredible sets for your shoots. What is your inspiration? Do you have a team you work with? How long does it typically take from the idea to the final set?

„I love old film and am an artist at heart, so I want to create beautiful sets that inspire my models. I love working with just one other artist and a carpenter to make the sets so we are a small team. We live in a world of Artificial Intelligence so it's important to create real things, to make real art that engages people directly not through a screen or app. It's an experience coming into my studio like stepping into a fairytale story. So I want people to feel connected, a part of that story when I shoot them.

I have a detail process when I make a set: firstly, I make sketches in pencil – they are little worlds, works of art and from those sketches we scale it up and build it in the same way that a film story board is made. It's a very satisfying process.“

What excites you most about recreating classic PinUp pictures?

„I think the energy and relationship with the model, it's that spark, that moment when you capture something, it's often joyful for both me and the person I am shooting and I am very animated when I work. I love to give lots of direction and advice. I have had over 30 years experience so right down to posing a finger tip, I love to create shapes and I love lighting too so part of what I am 'famous' for I suppose is those lighting plots. I learnt those from the original pin up photographers like Bruno of Hollywood so that technical part, the painting with studio lights, is great when you hit the perfect lighting plot.“

What is the weirdest/craziest feedback you ever got on your pictures?

„Oh god. It's seeing them as tattoos on people bodies! That's weird but I kind of love it, the fact that people will have my images on their skin probably after I die it's weird though. So yes that has been a 'whoa, what in sweet burlesque hell is that' when people come up to me at festivals and events with my work on their leg!! They have been in gay porn films , Hollywood films, a side of a plane, a bus in London and I was in the Victoria and Albert Museum with a portrait of Dita Von Teese I did. World famous Bob said of my work in an interview 'pictures are so beautiful I just want to crawl inside them', so that was wonderfully weird and an honour at the same time.“

What would your dream photoshoot look like? Are there any special people and/or locations that you would like to photograph?

„My mind is constantly filling with ideas. So I make about five sets a year and they get better the more experience I and my assistant Domina have in making them. I would love to be in one of those creepy old universal studio castle sets like Bride of Frankenstein or Dracula with the old mad science labs. So Hollywood in the 1930s would be a dream on those grand old sets. Shadowy worlds with gothic touches. I love drama on sets – not so much in my real life, but yes, I love detail and fantasy. I love old theatres too, there are some amazing spaces in Los Angeles, like the Orpheum and Mayan Theatre I would love to shoot in.“



You must have seen millions of burlesque shows. What are your favorite burlesque acts? What are the most unusual acts you have seen?

„No surprise but I love the strange and wonderful acts. I love your Champagne glass act. Before we knew each other you came to my studio and we shot that and I thought it was amazing – with the fake legs, literally 100s of people liked that video we shot of that act before reels were popular. So, yes, I do love innovation and intelligence with acts. Chrissy Kiss does an incredible half and half Addams Family act as both Gomez and Morticia, classic half and half act, which I booked for my Halloween show. That was genius. Dirty Martini does an act where she is caught in a spiders web and these six arms come out of the web and disrobe her which is amazing. Laurie Hagen does a reverse strip, it's all backwards – even the music! Which is incredible as the choreography is so skilled. I also love to laugh and for me burlesque is about holding an audience, capturing their imagination. Being thrilled at the skill and talent of the artist on stage.“

In which way did the world of Burlesque change, since you are part of it?

„I think it's always been female led and about female empowerment. That has never changed. I think social media is the big change and the way that has divided us in some ways. We have come on in leaps and bounds in terms of equality but live in a more divided society due to being polarised by what we read and see on social media. I much prefer seeing burlesque life on stage and forming my own opinions and being educated or enlightened.

So burlesque is still here, which amazes me that 25 years or so on from its resurgence it's still going strong.

I love that I get invited to go to Tokyo or Prague, Mainz or Manchester and there are these crazy people getting near to naked on stages around the earth, it still holds it's magic for me all the years later after that visit to Dixie!“


